THE MASTIFF BAT, *EUMOPS PEROTIS*, IN SOUTHERN NEVADA

On 1 March 1966, a male mastiff bat, *Eumops perotis*, was found dead under several cottonwood trees in Las Vegas, Nevada. The specimen was brought to Nevada Southern University for identification by a representative of the Clark County Health Department.

This is the first record of *E. perotis* for Nevada although Hall (Mammals of Nevada, p. 643, 1946) placed this species on the hypothetical list for the state. The specimen (M-7000) is on deposit in the mammal collection of the Biology Museum, Nevada Southern University. Standard measurements are: total length, 175; tail, 72; hind foot, 14; ear, 44; tragus, 7; and forearm, 79.—W. GLEN BRADLEY AND MICHAEL J.
